

## Memorial Dedication Scheduled

The grave of Mary Ellen Pleasant at Tulocay Cemetery will be the scene tomorrow of a memorial dedication service, as part of the observance of Negro History Week, sponsored by the San Francisco Negro Historical and Cultural Society.

The grave of Miss Pleasant, who was the famous "Mammy Pleasant" of early San Francisco, has been marked with a newly engraved headstone and sculpture, which bears the inscription: "The mother of civil rights in California," and also notes that she was "a friend of John Brown." Although Miss Pleasant was never a resident of Napa, she was buried in Tulocay Cemetery after her death while visiting at the home of friends here.

A motorcade of the historical society members will drive to Napa for the ceremonies following a program at the Bethel AME Church in San Francisco. The Tulocay rites are scheduled at the graveside at 2 p.m.

The observance of Negro History Week includes other events in San Francisco, including a panel discussion at 10 a.m. Sunday on KGO-TV on "The Negro's Fight For Dignity and Equality." Panelists will be Evielo Grillo; Attorney Richard Bancroft; Dr. Thomas Burbridge; Dr. Carlton B. Goodlet, William Brady and Joseph Hann.

Displays during the week include a collection of books and pictures about Negroes at the main branch of the San Francisco Public Library. Other displays are at the Emporium, the Junior Museum, Howard Presbyterian Church and Bethel AME Church.
